Getting to know you.

We have been so pleased with the way the first groups of children have settled in to Nursery life so far 😊

As our settling in process continues, we will continue to closely observe how the children are managing with the increasing session length and group size and let you know if any changes need to be made for your child's needs.

In these early weeks, we will continue to support children in making new friends and following our Nursery routines and rules. We will be learning our new friend's names, talking about our likes and dislikes and enjoying familiar stories and songs.

We will also be discussing Autumn and looking out for signs of the change in Season.

Drop Off and Pick Up

Just a reminder that parents are still required to socially distance on site and we ask that you do not congregate at the school gates, in line with the Department of Education guidance. The easiest way to manage social distancing when waiting is standing in a spaced out line, keeping your child with you. This also makes it easier for us to dismiss the children as we can see who is waiting, and who is next. Many thanks for your continued co-operation.

A reminder that parents and carers are still encouraged to wear masks on school grounds, unless medically exempt.

Self Registration - from next week on, we will ask the children to find their name on a handprint each morning and stick it onto our board. Name recognition is one of the first 'pre reading' skills, and it's also a great chance for the children to complete a task independently and feel proud when they find their own name.
